Reading Group: Fascism and Fighting the Far Right Today

Three part discussion on the history and nature of fascism and how to fight it today

First session, Sun. February 14th

In the first session will be historical, and briefly discuss the nature of fascist movements and fascist (military coups. We will look at the rise of the Nazi party in Germany, and Trotsky's conception of a United Front.

- Read from the <u>Fighting Fascism pamphlet</u>: Introduction (4 pages); Chapter 1 "What Is Fascism" pages 7-11; Chapter 3 "Lessons from the Past" (1930s) pages 21-25, 28. Feel free to read the whole pamphlet through, but we will be discussing these historical sections first, and the more recent examples later.
- Read Leon Trotsky's "For a Worker's United Front Against Fascism" from 1931.

Second session, Sun. February 21st

We will be discussion later implementations of the united front and strategies for fighting fascism, from the Battle of Cable street. We will have a member of the original Anti-Nazi league in the UK help introduce, and also discuss the recent fight against Golden Dawn in Greece.

Third session, Sun. March 8th

We will be discussion fascism today, how to characterize the new hybrid electoral parties in Europe, how that model compares to the United States, and concentrating on the rise of the far-right in the US under Trump and after, with an eye on strategies of combatting them, and the role of socialists within that.

- We will read from various short, contemporary articles on the far-right under Trump and today.
 These give a range of left responses and are meant to be read critically, in light of the previous readings. Examples:

The Holocaust: In the most extreme example of the horrors of fascism, between 1939 and 1945, six million Jews, at least 250,000 Roma, and tens of thousands of LGBT people and people with mental illness or disability were massacred in death camps in Germany and Nazi-occupied eastern Europe as part of a program of industrial genocide. There is an informative ongoing debate on Marxist understanding of the Holocaust involving the IS tendency:
